This includes how we plan to run before and after school club. To minimise any risk of transmission there will be no inter class groups such as spelling groups or inter class interventions. We will review this approach at half term. This has been reviewed and not changed due to the increase in COVID-19 cases. In order to reduce the risk of transmission we will minimise movement of staff between bubbles e.g. TA and PPA cover to where absolutely necessary (adult links to be restricted to 2 classes). This has since been reviewed and reduced so that TA staff are now allocated to one class only wherever possible. Class sizes now reduced to the very minimum (maximum 10 children in each class if at all possible) to minimise the risk of transmission back to households and to protect the health and well-being of staff.
